#### Premises description & other relevant information

Love's Farm House is a community centre built on behalf of Huntingdonshire District Council, who oversaw the construction and certification for use of the building.

The building is managed by the Trustees of Love's Farm Community Centre CIO, registered charity number 1157648.

The newly constructed building is managed and maintained by the trustees to a high level. The strategy for the building was appropriate at the time of construction and handover in 2015.

Love's Farm House is conjoined to the adjacent Pre School and their fire alarms are interlinked. The two demises have a common locked fire door which is provided for ongoing flexibility and sustainability (BREEAM) purposes.

Love's Farm House consists of a Foyer, Main Hall, Kitchen, Meeting Room and Office. There are male, female and accessible toilets. There are storage cupboards within the office, meeting room and main hall, as well as a cleaner's cupboard. All rooms and cupboards are protected by fire doors. Outside of the building, there is a garden with paved, astroturf and bark areas, enclosed by a timber fence. Separated by a timber fence from the garden is an access route to the gas governor at the rear of the property. See attached indicative plan.

No major modifications have been made to the building.

The trustees have employed specialist contractors to undertake maintenance of the various systems and equipment.

In accordance with the recommendations of the Fire Safety Risk Assessment carried out in June 2019, the Fire Alarm Log Book now contains all the fire safety records and certificates for the building, including the Fire Risk Assessment, records of the fire alarm and emergency lights tests, the Fire Alarm Inspection Certificate and the Fire Extinguisher Inspection Certificate.

- An Electrical Installation Condition Report was carried out on 2 February 2023 and will be repeated every 5 years.
- PAT Testing is carried out annually, most recently in May 2023. This includes all portable appliances, including portable heaters.
- Trailing leads, extension cables and adaptors are avoided where possible. However, due to the nature of the A/V equipment in the building this is not always possible. Cable covers are kept in the office to make trailing leads safe, and extension cables / adaptors are used according to their safe working limits.
- There are no electric vehicle charging points on the premises.
- No smoking signs are situated around the building. Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the premises during the opening hours of the adjacent Pre-School. Outside these hours, smoking is permitted on the patio in the back garden but there is no signed, designated smoking area. Love's Farm House bar staff put ash trays on the patio during bar nights and evening parties and these are cleared either by bar staff that evening or by caretakers the following morning. We should consider allocating a dedicated smoking area in the back garden, with appropriate signage and fixed ash trays.
- Waste bins are kept closed and locked and are emptied regularly.
- Gas bottles for the barbeque are kept in a secure, locked cage along the path at the side of the building. Appropriate signage is posted.
- Access is provided to Love's Farm House through the main entrance. This
  has various modes of operation and is generally on exit-only mode while
  events are taking place and when the office is not staffed. The entrance is
  open when the office is staffed. When the doors are set to exit-only, the
  magnetic locks operate and the door can only be opened via the push button
  on the wall in the foyer. The magnetic locks are wired into the fire alarm and
  the magnets break when the fire alarm goes off. There is also an emergency
  break glass which can be pressed to open the doors.
- There have been several instances of children and teenagers trespassing in the garden by climbing the fence. The fence has now been painted with anticlimb paint and appropriate signage posted.
- Hot work activities do not normally take place on the premises.

- Fire exits are situated at the front door and at the back and side of the main hall. All exits open outwards.
- Inner rooms have fire doors and have a lower published capacity than outer rooms, to ensure ease of escape in the event of a fire.
- The building is all on one level and all fire exits are double width. The main fire exit from the foyer consists of swing doors which open automatically in the event of a fire alarm.
- All Love's Farm House staff who carry out a caretaking role are trained to check fire escape routes (both internal and external) regularly to ensure that that there is a clear, unobstructed path to each exit.
- The Love's Farm House Terms & Conditions of Hire require hirers to read and comply with the fire notices and familiarise themselves with the fire alarm points, location of extinguishers and available escape routes. The Terms & Conditions of Hire notify hirers of their responsibility to ensure the rapid and safe evacuation of members of their group from the building in the event of a fire.
- The Love's Farm House Fire Procedures are sent to all regular hirers when they make their original booking and periodically thereafter, and are available on the hirer portal to which all regular hirers have access.
- The fire procedures are printed on the back of the party information card which is given to one-off / party hirers before their event.
